The Google form will ask for:

- your name
- your institutional affiliation, if applicable

- your title (identifying whether you are faculty, a student, or an independent scholar—all are invited to submit)
- your contact information
- a 500-word abstract of the essay
- a one-page works cited list

Session coordinators will select essays based on the overall clarity of the project and the time limitations of the conference itself. Authors initially selected must submit full versions of their essays by **January 31, 2024** and register for the conference for final approval for the session.

Please note that no individual may submit to more than two symposia, including the Pitch Your Book session. This limit is put in place to avoid scheduling conflicts and to provide more individuals the opportunity to present.
