

# Playwriting Symposium Call for Actors, Directors, and Dramaturgs

# The 45th Annual Mid-America Theatre Conference March 6-8, 2025 Crown Plaza Hotel, Atlanta, GA

The Playwriting Symposium of the Mid-America Theatre Conference seeks Actors, Directors, Dramaturgs for Dramatists Play Lab and Pitch-Your-Play Showcase.

All submissions must be received by Friday, Nov. 15th, 2024.

This call is directed to academic theatre artists (faculty members or graduate students) and/or to professional Independent Artists, especially those located in the greater Atlanta area. Applications are also welcome from undergraduates with a faculty member's letter of recommendation.

The symposium enthusiastically echoes MATC's commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion, and especially encourages submissions from theatre artists of color and/or from other underrepresented groups.

The Mid-America Theatre Conference commits to advancing intersectional equity, inclusivity, and diversity; creating a conference that is welcoming and fully accessible; and to disrupting the ongoing damage of white supremacy within MATC and the broader academic and theatrical worlds. As part of this effort, we highly encourage a broad range of submissions by presenters or about theatre of historically disenfranchised and underrepresented populations, particularly those of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color communities. The Dramatists Play Lab features new, unproduced, ten-minute plays, which are presented as script-in-hand performances.

The Pitch-Your-Play Showcase offers playwrights of full-length and one-act plays an opportunity to receive critical feedback from a dramaturg along with a staged reading performance of a 10-minute excerpt of the play at the All-Conference Pitch-Your-Play Showcase. Dramaturgs will be expected to give a short "elevator pitch" for each play at the beginning of its performance.

For both events, each selected play will have an assigned Creative Team comprised of a director, dramaturg, and actor(s). All participants assigned to a particular play will receive a digital copy of the final script prior to the start of the conference, and one preliminary conversation—via email, video conference, conference call, etc.—is required of each Creative Team. Participants are therefore expected to reply to emails in a timely fashion to schedule this pre-conference conversation, as well as to make arrangements for the 75-minute, on-site rehearsal.

All selected theatre artists must register for the conference. Unfortunately, the conference is unable to provide funding to assist with the costs of travel and/or lodging. However, a limited number of actors from the Atlanta area may apply to receive an honorarium of \$100 to participate as well as a waiver of the conference fee. ## All proposals must include:

## **ACTORS**:

Please submit the following three (3) documents:

- Document one (1): a recent headshot or photo saved as jpg file format
- Document two (2): a resume or bio saved as .doc, .docx, or PDF file format
- Please ensure that the resume or bio specifies Actor's Equity status
- Document three (3): a brief letter (1 page or less) describing the types of roles you usually play. Please also note any experience working with new plays and/or staged readings. Save the letter as .doc, .docx, or PDF file format
- Please note: accepted actors will likely be assigned to two plays

#### **DIRECTORS**:

Please submit the following two (2) documents:

• Document one (1): a resume or CV detailing directing experience saved as .doc, .docx, or PDF file format



• Document two (2): a brief letter (1 page or less) describing your approach to directing and the types of work you are drawn to as a director. We strive to match each script to a director interested in that genre or style. Please emphasize in the letter any experience developing new plays or directing staged readings. Save the letter as .doc, .docx, or PDF file format

#### **DRAMATURGS:**

Please submit the following two (2) documents:

- Document one (1): a resume or CV detailing dramaturgical experience saved as .doc or .docx, or PDF file format
- Document two (2): a brief letter (1 page or less) describing your dramaturgy experience, both with new work and in other capacities. We ask that you also describe the types of work you are drawn to as a dramaturg, as we strive to match each script to a dramaturg interested in that genre, style, or length of play. Finally, it is imperative that you indicate whether you are interested in serving in the Dramatists Play Lab, Plays-In-Progress program, or both. Save the letter as .doc, .docx, or PDF file format

# NOTE: Theatre artists who do not follow the above guidelines will not be considered.

The Playwriting Symposium is eager for, and appreciative of, your help in advertising the conference to theatre artists in both academic and professional theatres within the reach of the conference location.
